Reforms Have Been Done!!!
UNC Moving Forward to a Radiant Future!!!

The chairs of the Rams Club and the Board of Trustees have exchanged places, thus ensuring that the Club's benevolent direction of university affairs will continue as we move forward. The announcement was received with stormy applause in the hall.
